Yeah, baby! We went and found us a vortex.



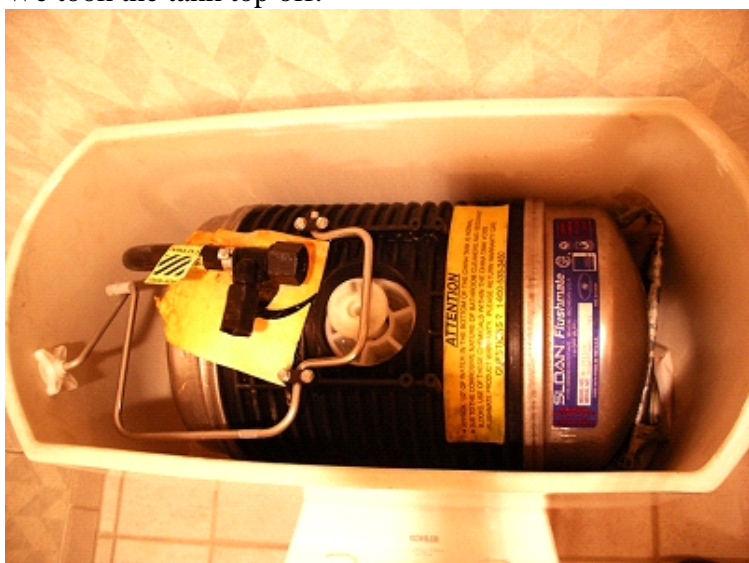
This is Bell Rock, a well documented vortex location. Up we went.
